**Hygiene Items:**

MREs – Check expiration date

Option - Beef Jerky / Beef Stew (can

opener)

Water<sup>4</sup> (Bottled / Canteen)

Plastic Bottle

Complete frequent inspection, preferably monthly, to verify there are no out dated or expired items. Any expired items will be removed and replaced.

Place the gear and other items preferably in a back pack. Although you are easier to be found if you remain with your aircraft, the back pack is easier to carry if you do have to relocate your position.

Mark your survival kit with the proper weight. Use this weight while completing the flights aircraft weight and balance charting. Ensue the allowable weight for Baggage areas two (2) in the C-172 and Hat shelf in the C-182 are not exceeded. While essential to survival, you will want to keep the pack as light as possible.
